Cell Phone Policy

As our culture continues to grow with advances in technology, we are challenged with the disruption to the educational environment brought forward by student use of cell phones. While we understand the need for increased communication, we will allow for students to use their phones in appropriate areas between classes and during their lunch. THIRD OFFENSE: Three (3) day **at home suspension** and phone is confiscated. Meeting with student, parents and administration required.

Parents, we understand this requires a change in habits for many of us as well. We ask that you still do not text or call your student during school hours and to contact the attendance office to deliver important messages. If necessary, students will be allowed to use the phone in the attendance office.

Our primary goal is to offer students well-rounded nutritional choices for lunch. The full lunch, including a main entree, fruit, vegetable, bread and milk is



\$2.50. Breakfast prices will be \$1.25. Sandwich Central will be \$3.00. Students who received free or reduced price lunches are eligible to continue until October 10, on the same status, or until the application has been approved or denied.

For your benefit, please return the application which is enclosed in this newsletter or visit www.LunchApp.com for an online application by October 1. If you don't get one, please call the school. Please throw away any old applications from last year. The state requires us to use a new one each year. If you have questions about the application, please call Louanne Warner, Food Service Director at 387-4542.

We encourage parents to take advantage of our pre-pay option or to prepay online. The online option can be found by clicking on the Food Services link at www.ypsd.us You may deposit money in your son/daughter's lunch account which will reduce the risk of lost or misused money. You may write a check payable to Yale Public Schools to ensure your child will have lunch every day. Due to the difficulty and time expended to recover outstanding balances, there is a no lunch charge policy (see below). If there are extenuating circumstances for your child, please contact Mr. Flynn at the school. (387-3231)

Yale Public Schools Chartwells Dining Services *Charge Policy* Yale Public Schools District Policy

This policy is designed for the convenience of the parents and students. We know that things get forgotten, so we allow a student to charge a **SCHOOL MEAL ONLY** lunch one time. A la Carte selections are not allowed to charge.

After one charge all students will receive a sandwich and a milk, they will not go without eating. Their lunch account will be charged 75 cents for these items.

Students can see their balances at the register and when a student goes in the red and the cashier lets them know they need to bring in money. Parents do have the option of not allowing the children) to charge at all.

We know this is an inconvenience to some but the charging of school lunches have become a big problem in our district. Free and reduced lunch applications can be filled out anytime during the school year. An application is enclosed in the newsletter sent home at the beginning of each year or you can call your school

Bad Debt Policy – Food Service Program

The operation and supervision of the food service program shall be the responsibility Yale Public Schools. Food services shall be operated on a self-supporting basis with revenue from students, staff, Federal reimbursement and surplus food. The Board shall assist the program by furnishing available space, initial major equipment, and utensils. Maintenance and replacement of equipment is the responsibility of the program.

A periodic review of the food service accounts shall be made by the Food Service Director and Business Manager. Any surplus funds from the National School Lunch Program shall be used to reduce the cost of the service to the students, improve the quality of food served or to purchase cafeteria-related equipment. Surplus funds from a-la-carte foods purchased using funds from the nonprofit food service account must accrue to the nonprofit food service account.

Bad debt incurred through the inability to collect lunch payment from students is not an allowable cost chargeable to any Federal program. Any related collection cost, including legal cost, arising from such bad debt after delinquent accounts have determined to be uncollectable are also unallowable.

Bad debt is uncollectable/delinquent debt that has been determined to be uncollectable by the end of the school year in which the debt was incurred. If the uncollectable/delinquent debt cannot be recovered by the School Meals Program in the year when the debt was incurred, then this is classified as bad debt. Once classified as bad debt, non-Federal funding sources must reimburse the NSFSA for the total amount of the bad debt. Funds may come from the district general fund, State or local funding, school or community organizations (PTA or student clubs) or any other non-federal source. Once the uncollectable/delinquent debt charges are converted to bad debt, records relating to those charges will be maintained per the State's Record Retention policy.

All forms of lunch shaming as outlined in Sec. 31k of the state school aid act will be strictly prohibited. Students who cannot pay for a school meal or who owe negative balance:

- o Must not be required to wear a wristband, handstamp or identified in any public way.
- \circ Must not be required to perform chores or other work to pay for school meals.
- Must not be required to dispose of a meal after it has been served because the student is unable to pay for the meal or has a negative balance.
- Must not be approached in the presence of other students to discuss the lunch balance.

This policy also requires direct communication with a parent, legal guardian through telephone, mail and electronic mail prior to communicating directly with the student.

- 4. COMPLIANCE all local, State and National mandatory guidelines for food service industry will be followed.

3300 Facilities, Real, and Personal Property

3301A Purchasing and Procurement with Federal Funds

This Policy applies to purchases of property and services with federal funds and subject to the Uniform Grant Guidance. All terms in this Policy have the same respective meanings as defined by federal regulation (2 CFR 200.1-99).

A. State Law Requirements Still Apply

Bidding requirements under Policy 3301 and Policy 3306, as applicable, remain enforceable in addition to any requirements in this Policy.

B. Procurement Methods

The District must use 1 of the following procurement methods that includes information sufficient to inform all potential bidders about the District's technical, service, and bid procedure requirements:

- 1. Purchases up to \$10,000 (micro-purchases)
 - a. To the extent District administration determines that the cost of the purchase is reasonable, micro-purchases may be made or awarded without bidding in accordance with this Policy. For purposes of this subsection, "reasonable" means the purchase is comparable to market prices for the geographic area.
 - b. To the extent practicable, the District will distribute micro-purchases equitably among qualified suppliers.
- 2. Purchases between \$10,000 and \$250,000 (small purchase procedures)

The District will use a bidding procedure in Policy 3301 subsection C.1., except that the District may use the bidding procedure in subsection B.1.a, above, for purchases up to the then-current state bid threshold published annually by MDE if the District satisfies the annual certification requirements of 2 CFR 200.320(a)(1)(iv).

- 3. Purchases over \$250,000
 - a. The District must either receive sealed bids through formal advertising or prepare a comprehensive request for proposals and submit it to at least 5 sources.
 - b. With either method, the District will perform a price analysis, making an independent estimate of costs before receiving bids.



- C. The District will take affirmative steps to assure that minority-owned businesses, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms are included in bidding opportunities.
- D. A person may protest the veracity, conformity, or eligibility of a bid. The District will handle bid protests as follows:
 - 1. Within 48 hours of the time bid results are available, the protesting person will submit a written protest to the Superintendent describing in detail the nature of the protest;
 - 2. The Superintendent or designee will review the written protest, and the Superintendent may bring it to the Board's attention in the Superintendent's discretion; and
 - 3. A person's failure to file a protest as described above is an irrevocable waiver of the bid protest.

Nothing in this Policy reduces or eliminates the District's rights or protections afforded under the law.

E. The District will retain all bids and formal bid solicitation documents for a period of 6 years after the bid opening date, or longer if required by law.

3300 Facilities, Real, and Personal Property

3301 Purchasing and Procurement

This Policy applies to all purchases of materials, supplies, and equipment. Purchases acquired through lease financing are governed by this Policy, but true leases (i.e., rental agreements) are not.

A. Responsibility for Purchasing

The District's administration, under the Superintendent's supervision, may purchase items for the District, subject to any parameters established by the Board.

- B. When Competitive Bidding is Required
 - 1. The District must competitively bid the purchase of an item or group of items costing an amount equal to or greater than the then-current state bid threshold published annually by MDE.
 - 2. The District does not need to competitively bid a purchase in an emergency or if competitive bidding is not required by law.
 - 3. The District will not artificially segregate purchases into smaller orders to avoid the bid threshold.
- C. Bidding Procedure
 - 1. The District may competitively bid a purchase using 1 or more of the following methods:
 - a. Requesting written price quotations from at least 3 known and practical vendors of an item;
 - b. Distributing a request for proposals to at least 3 known and practical vendors of an item;
 - c. Posting a request for proposals on the District's website or any other website that regularly informs vendors of bid opportunities;
 - d. Selecting a contract awarded to a winning bidder under a bid process operated by a reputable bid cooperative if the District determines, after reasonable due diligence, that the bid procedure used by the bid cooperative was fair and open, resulted in a bid award to the lowest responsible bidder, and the contract price is comparable to current market rates for the purchased item; or



- e. Any other process, in the Superintendent's or designee's discretion, that is likely to result in at least 3 known vendors providing bids for the item sought, regardless of whether at least 3 bids are actually received.
- 2. Each bidder responding to a request for proposals must certify that it is not an Iran-linked business as defined by MCL 129.312.
- 3. Awarding Bids
 - a. If competitive bidding is required by law, any contract must be awarded by the Board to the lowest responsible bidder.
 - b. In determining bidder responsibility, the District may take 1 or more of the following into account:
 - The District's experience with the bidder;
 - Others' experience with the bidder;
 - The bidder's history of satisfactory performance or questionable litigation, protests, or disputes;
 - The bidder's capitalization and solvency;
 - The length of time the bidder has been engaged in its business;
 - The recommendation of the District's professional consultants; and
 - Any other factor consistently and lawfully applied.
 - c. In any bid procedure, the District reserves the right to reject any or all bids or waive any informalities or irregularities in the bid process.
- 4. Michigan-Based Business Preference
 - a. The District may give up to a 10% preference to a bidder that is a Michiganbased business as defined by MCL 18.1268.
 - b. The Michigan-based business preference will not apply if federal funds are used for the purchase.
- D. Purchases Using State Aid Act Funds
 - 1. The District will not use state aid to purchase foreign goods or services if American goods or services are available, competitively priced, and of comparable quality.
 - The District will give a preference to goods or services manufactured or provided by Michigan businesses if competitively priced and of comparable quality.



- 3. The District will give a preference to goods or services manufactured or provided by Michigan businesses owned and operated by veterans if competitively priced and of comparable quality.
- E. Purchases Using Federal Funds

Purchases made with federal funds and subject to the federal Uniform Grant Guidance are also governed by Policy 3301A.
